Toronto/Accra — **October 8, 2025.** The Black Food Sovereignty Alliance (BFSA), the University of Ghana, and TMU's Centre for Studies in Food Security will host a cross-continental Roundtable on October 16, convening thought leaders, practitioners, scholars, and community members from Ghana, Canada, and the U.S. in a hybrid format to broaden participation and impact.

The Roundtable will deepen understanding of Black Food Sovereignty, highlight transformational leadership, examine case studies that build community capacity and influence policy, and explore collaboration pathways to address racial inequities in food systems while strengthening governance across Black-led organizations.
